Dear Providence Residents, Community Providers, and Other Partners—

Welcome to the Healthy Communities Office's 2016 Mental Health Resource Guide. Rhode Island is often cited for having unusually high rates of mental illness and substance use, but rather than reflecting an unusually acute problem, some people believe that this reflects a positive culture in our state where people are aware of mental health, where fewer problems go unreported, and where everyone is encouraged to seek services.

Even if more of us seek mental health care in Rhode Island than in other states, we also realize that many Providence residents may not know where to access the best mental health care services for themselves or their family members- or may not even think to take the first step towards finding care. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Service Administration's (SAMHSA) "Receipt of Services for Behavioral Health Problems: Results from the 2014 National Survey on Drug Use and Health" report found that of the 5.3 million adults aged 18 or older with a perceived unmet need for mental health care who did not receive mental health services, 45% could not afford the cost, 28% thought they could handle the problem without treatment, 23% did not know where to go for services, 16% did not have time, and 11% didn't think treatment would help. With information in this guide, the hope is that many more will take advantage of services and support available in and around Providence.

If you or someone you know is experiencing emotional or behavioral challenges, please seek help. Most people do not hesitate to go to the doctor when they have a physical health concern, and we should treat mental health the same way. If you are not sure whether your mental or emotional state is something to be concerned about, it is worth seeking out a provider to ask. Your primary health care physician is a good place to start. We hope that this resource guide can also be helpful.

About This Guide

The Resource Guide is divided into 5 **primary focus sections** that give a general idea to what an organization's overall focus is.

1. **Basic Needs**- emergency food, clothing, emergency housing assistance, rent, mortgage, and utility assistance.
2. **Children, Youth, and Families**— programs mainly focused on the family unit, child welfare, and mothers. Specialized resources for Spanish-speaking and LGBTQ+ residents are included.
3. **Inpatient Treatment**— hospitalization and addiction recovery resources.
4. **Mental Health and Recovery Services**- behavioral healthcare and outpatient treatment services located in the community.
5. **Other Services**— various other resources that are important to mental health but cannot specifically be categorized into the previous sections.

Each entry in this resource guide details a different organization that serves the Providence community and includes information that lists the services the organization provides, the clientele they serve, any special programs the organization offers, the languages the organization speaks, and the forms of payment that are accepted by the organization. While we strive to provide the most current information, please note that organization services may change.

Other Terms In This Guide:

- **Day Treatment**— partial hospitalization where a patient resides at home but commutes to treatment.
- **Helpline/Hotlines**- emotional, social, and/or financial support through peer-to-peer interactions.
- **HIV/STD**— specialized programs, advocacy, or support individuals affected by HIV/AIDS or other sexually transmitted diseases.
- **Housing or Temporary Residence**— shelters and supportive community organizations that provide refuge.
- **Insurance**— support and information regarding Medicare, Medicaid, private, and other types of insurance.
- **Mental Health Services**— support and treatment for individuals or families affected by mental health difficulties.
- **Outpatient**— medical treatment provided without admittance to hospital.
- **Prescription Assistance**— discounts, programs, or other means to help with payment for prescriptions.
- **Psychiatric Services**— the study, diagnosis, and treatment of affective, behavioral, cognitive, and perceptual mental disorders.
- **Recovery Support Services**— removal of obstacles before and during recovery as well as enhancement of quality of life for persons in recovery and their families.
- **Residential Treatment**— live-in health care facility providing therapy and treatment for substance use disorders.

Forms of Payment Accepted

For each organization listed in this guide, we list the methods, if necessary, to compensate organization for services provided. Below are the definitions of the forms of payment listed in this guide.

- **Employer Sponsored/Private Insurance**— health plan provided through employer or by an individual through private company.
- **Free- All Services**— all interactions and services are free of charge.
- **Free- Limited Services**— some but not all services are free of charge.
- **Medicaid**— largest source of funding for medical health-related services for people with low income in the United States.
- **Medicare**— social service that guarantees access to health insurance for American over 65 years of age.
- **Out of Pocket**— compensation for services covered by money of individual rather than another source.
- **Sliding Scale Fee**— payment methods that vary based on income or other factors.
- **Tricare**— health care insurance program of the United States Department of Defense Military Health System generally used by military families.

- Open to all Providence residents, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.
- Unused and expired medicines that remain in home medicine cabinets can be susceptible to misuse and abuse.
- The following items may be dropped off in the MedReturn bin: prescription patches, prescription medications, prescription ointments, over-the-counter medications, vitamins, medication samples and pet medications.
- The following items are not accepted: liquids, thermometers, hydrogen peroxide, inhalers, aerosol cans, lotions and "sharps" (i.e., needles, lancets, syringes and IVs).
- Residents with needles are encouraged to return them to AIDS Care Ocean State's needle exchange program, which can be reached at (401) 521-3603.
- Deposit pills in ziplock bags, not pill bottles displaying personal medical information.
